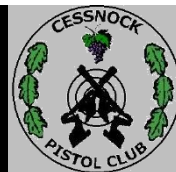

Dear members,

Covid19 update

The pandemic situation across the country has vastly improved since our last review and restrictions can be eased once again. A quick summary of the changes is below and please see the full reviewed covid19 safety plan for more details. The reviewed plan is effective from Monday 7 December 2020.

Social distancing

Minimum distances have now halved to 1 person per 2 square meters both indoors and outdoors. This has doubled the amount of people we can have in the club house. We will resume using communal kitchen facilities, but please ensure you was up your own utensils and do not leave it for another member to clean up after you.

On ranges with hard barriers between the bays (ranges 2 and 4) we can resume to using all bays. Ranges 3, 6 and 8 will remain every other bay for now.

Please remain vigilant when attending the club to ensure we are doing our part if the local situation deteriorates.

Club competitions

The club will hold the Wine Country black powder open in early February and has reserved a date for the Vintage Open in early March. Any restrictions to apply will be discussed closer to those dates

The committee will continue to monitor the situation and review our safety plan as required. I wish all of our members, visitors and friends the merriest of Christmases and look forward to an amazing new year.

Cessnock Pistol Club – Covid19 Safety Plan – Phase 4 – Effective 7 December 2020

Cessnock Pistol Club has moved on to phase 4 of its covid19 plan. This part of the plan aims to increase the amount of club facilities that can be used by members and visitors while maintaining a social distancing requirement of 1 person per 2 square meters. As was the case with previous phases, if any member falls ill or attends the club while ill, the club will need to return to full lockdown until the premises can be appropriately cleaned and this policy reviewed.

- 1. IF YOU ARE UNWELL, HAVE COME INTO CONTACT WITH A CONFIRMED CASE OF COVID19 OR ARE AWAITING TEST RESULTS FOR COVID19, DO NOT ATTEND CLUB PREMISES**
2. All guidelines, regulations and orders from State and Federal governments must be adhered to, as well as those provided by Sport NSW and the NSWAPA.
3. Shooting activities are permitted on **all days of the week**. Live fire activities are limited to daylight hours as per normal standing orders.
4. The Club House (not including the office or the score room) can be occupied to a maximum of **30 people at any one time**. Members must observe the **maximum of 1 person per 2 square meters rule** while not shooting. Those shooting must be at least 1m apart. Please be conscious of this rule while in small areas of the complex such as the bathrooms and the target room.
5. Communal kitchen facilities can be used. Please be sure to thoroughly wash any utensils you have used and wipe down surfaces when you have finished.
6. Please wash your hands and use hand sanitizer at least upon arrival and before leaving the premises.
- 7. The club is open to members, visitors and spectators. Visitors and spectators who do not share a household with a member must complete a covid19 safety declaration upon arrival. Training of new members can only occur on Saturday and Tuesday mornings. The visitor's book must be completed by all visitors as normal.**
8. Members and visitors are required to wipe down all surfaces in their bay at the conclusion of their match and after physical contact with any other surface.
9. When a club firearm is used, it must not be re-used until it has been appropriately sanitized.
10. While training under the provisions of the P650 regime, a face covering is recommended and social distancing is to be observed where possible while maintaining the appropriate level of supervision.
11. The Secretary and Treasurer may be on hand to make direct transactions with members during this phase, however members must be wary of the 1 person per 2 square meter rule when entering the office. It is still preferred that contact is made via email\mail\phone where possible. Cashless payment is also preferred at this time.
12. Please ensure that you sign in every time you attend and that all of your contact details are current with the Secretary. You can update your details via the Club's website.

Range occupancy guideline

Range	Matches	Max. Occupancy	Requirements
1	Action Match (Falling Plates)	3	Range officer remains at doorway, maximum of two shooters within range area
2	ISSF & 25yrd Service	9	One person per bay up to a maximum of 8 shooters per range and one range officer. 1 person per 2 square meters observed forward of the line.
3	ISSF & 25yrd Service	5	One empty bay between shooters and one range officer remaining at the door. 1 person per 2 square meters observed forward of the line.
4	ISSF & 25yrd Service	9	One person per bay up to a maximum of 8 shooters per range and one range officer. 1 person per 2 square meters observed forward of the line.
5	CLOSED		
6	50m (behind the line)	12	One empty bay between shooters and one range officer remaining at the door. 1 person per 2 square meters observed forward of the line.
7	50m (forward of line)	12	Range officer remains on central path. All Service bays may be occupied. 1 person per 2 square meters observed behind and forward of the line.
8	Air Pistol	12	One empty bay between shooters and one range officer per range.
